### Ethan Allen Homestead [ethanallenhomestead.org](http://ethanallenhomestead.org)

Open daily 10 AM – 4 PM.

Ethan Allen was an unusually flamboyant backwoodsman-turned-statesman from Connecticut. He was one of the early inhabitants of Burlington and is best known for the capture of Fort Ticonderoga at the outbreak of the Revolutionary War and his leadership of the Green Mountain Boys. Inside the Allen House you will see some of the daily tasks and skills required to survive on the Vermont frontier, as well as an introduction to Ethan's philosophical writings and land speculation activities.

### Queen City Ghost Walk

Queen City Ghostwalk is Vermont's original haunted history tour – the only tour in Vermont led by a published author of the paranormal. ## Lake Champlain Chocolate Factory Tour

## Burlington Waterfront

Downtown waterfront and community park with 900 feet of lakeshore, a boardwalk, and swinging benches make this a great place to sit and watch some of the beautiful sunsets that Burlington has to offer. Burlington's Waterfront Bike Path is a 7.6 mile recreational route that runs from the southern end of Burlington at Oakledge Park to the northern end at the Winooski River, where it connects via the bike path bridge to the Colchester Bike Path. The Bike Path rides along the Lake Champlain shoreline, offering wonderful views of the lake and the Adirondack Mountains to the west ([champlainbikeways.org/directions/#vtbikeways](http://champlainbikeways.org/directions/#vtbikeways)).

## Oak Ledge Park [enjoyburlington.com/venue/oakledge-park](http://enjoyburlington.com/venue/oakledge-park)

A universally accessible circular tree house distinguishes this South End city park, which also has a playground, beach, tennis and bocce courts, and a picnic shelter. Visitors can also access the nearby Earth Clock at Blanchard Beach. Its 14 imposing granite slabs stand in a 43-and-a-half-foot circle, right off the bike path. Constructed in 2007 by grassroots nonprofit Circles for Peace, it functions as a clock, compass, calendar and sundial, and hosts solstice ceremonies and sacred circle dances.
